Rev. Eleanor Jane Hartman (former member of HBC) passed away Monday, August 27th in Greenville, NC.

Obituary for Eleanor Jane Hartman Malefyt:

The Reverend Eleanor Jane Hartman Malefyt, 76, went home to be with her Lord on August 27, 2018 after battling Parkinson's disease and a brain tumor. Eleanor was a native of Newport News, VA, born to the late Charles and Blanche Woodfin Hartman. She graduated from Warwick High School, College of William and Mary, and Christopher Newport University, obtaining her undergraduate degree in Elementary Education. As a second-grade teacher, she used her love of music, and skill on the guitar and piano, to entertain and quiet her students. She wrote a collection of folk music, patriotic and Christian songs. Eleanor sang with her guitar as a part of weddings, celebrations, and a television commercial. She also was an entrepreneur, and owned a successful antique and thrift shop called 'Eleanor Jane's' that became a familiar part of Newport News culture in the late 1970's and 1980's.

Her customers appreciated her desire to befriend and get to know them personally, which was a hallmark of her kind and considerate personality.

In 1994, she felt called to ministry at the age of 52 and enrolled at Baptist Theological Seminary in Richmond, VA. After graduation, Eleanor served as Associate Pastor of Hilton Baptist Church in Newport News and later, Branch's Baptist Church in Richmond, VA.

In 2003, Eleanor married Dr. Calvin Malefyt, a fellow pastor. They moved to Greenville in 2004 and quickly integrated themselves into their new community. Eleanor served as Minister of Small Groups at Jarvis Memorial United Methodist Church and assisted in the formation of 74 study groups. While in Greenville, Eleanor also became active in an outreach ministry to Chinese Christians in the Pitt County area. She led women's small groups and found her greatest joy in helping new Christians grow in their faith. In 2015, she and Calvin moved to the Cypress Glen community where Eleanor continued to encourage spiritual growth by leading women's Bible studies.

Left to cherish her memory are her husband Calvin, her two daughters, Dr. Tamara Perdue and husband Phil of Greenville; Lynn Mosby and husband Steve of Moseley, VA; six grandchildren, Dr. Meredith Perdue Davis and husband Bobby, Lauren Burgess Perdue, Philip Sutherland Perdue III, Hannah Marie Mosby, Anderson West Mosby and Hope Lin Mosby. Eleanor also leaves a sister, Holly Hartman Germon and husband Terry of Doswell, VA and their son Brandon; and a brother Nelson Hartman of Newport News, VA.

Eleanor will be remembered for her love of music, her strong faith in God, her gifts of teaching and encouragement, and her friendly and beautiful smile. Missions Council Spotlight on Missions – “PPCC”



Peninsula Pastoral Counseling Center (PPCC) has appreciated the support of Hampton Baptist Church over the years. HBC's own Becky Glass is the Executive Director, and Ellen Barnes Velissarios and Martha Feathers Owens serve as counselors at PPCC; and Ann Michael serves on our Board of Directors as our Finance Chair. When a church contributes to PPCC, we divide the gift into two parts: 1/3 of the contribution goes into our Client Assistance Fund, which enables us to see clients who cannot afford counseling. Approximately 25% of our clients do not have insurance or have difficulty utilizing their insurance due to high deductibles or expensive copays. Last year, PPCC provided more than 1500 counseling sessions to those who did not use insurance or needed assistance with their copays. With the support of our Client Assistance Fund, PPCC was able to provide approximately \$153,825 worth of services on a budget of \$57,923. The other 2/3 of the contribution goes into a Pastor's Fund for Hampton Baptist Church. PPCC partners with local congregations and encourages the church to utilize the center as an extension of their pastoral care ministry to the church. The Pastor's Fund can be utilized for workshops, counseling for members, or continuing education for the church staff. This amount is set aside for the fiscal year from January - December. Any funds in the Pastor's Fund that are not used by the end of the year are transferred to the Client Assistance Fund.
